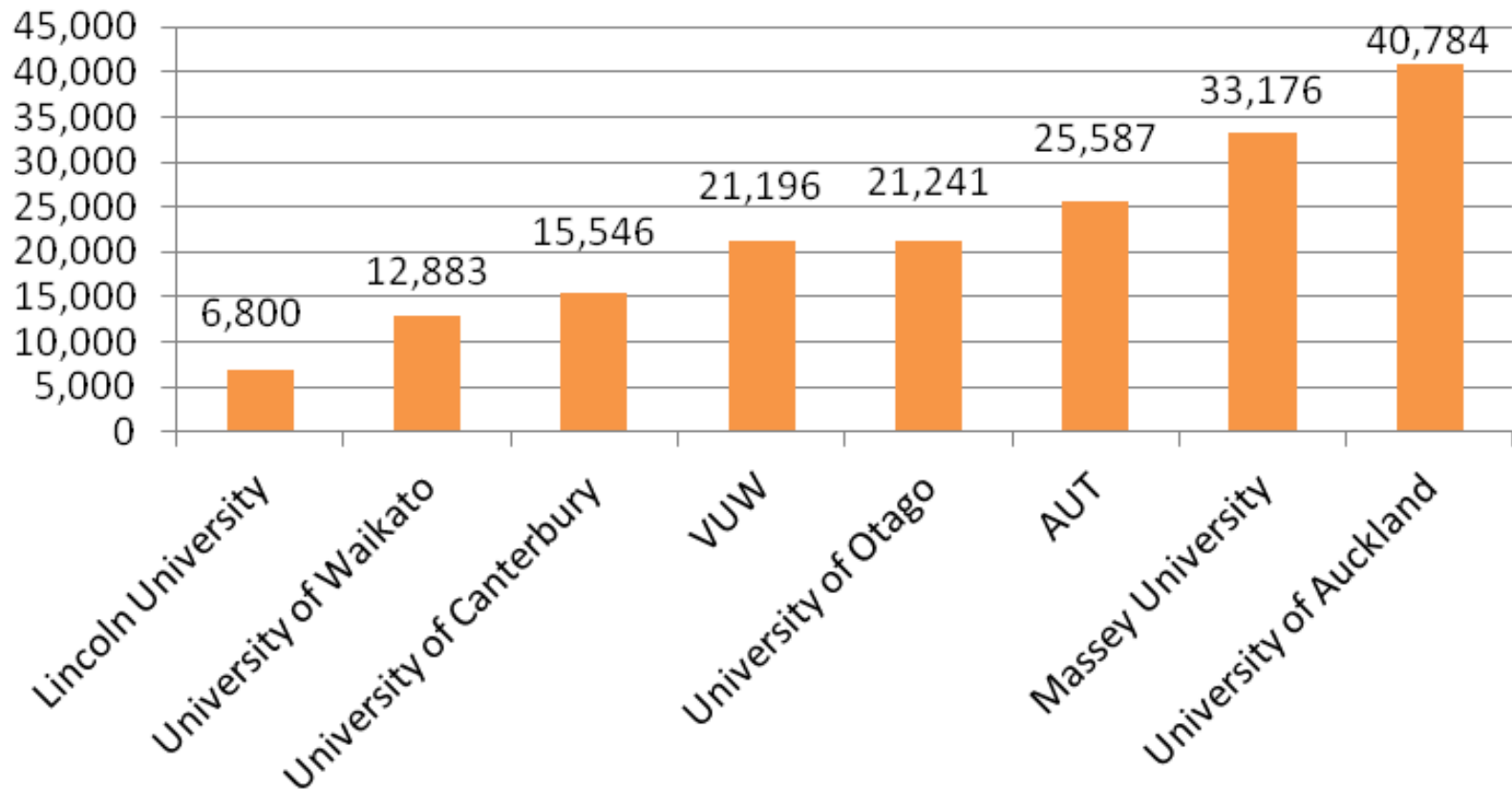

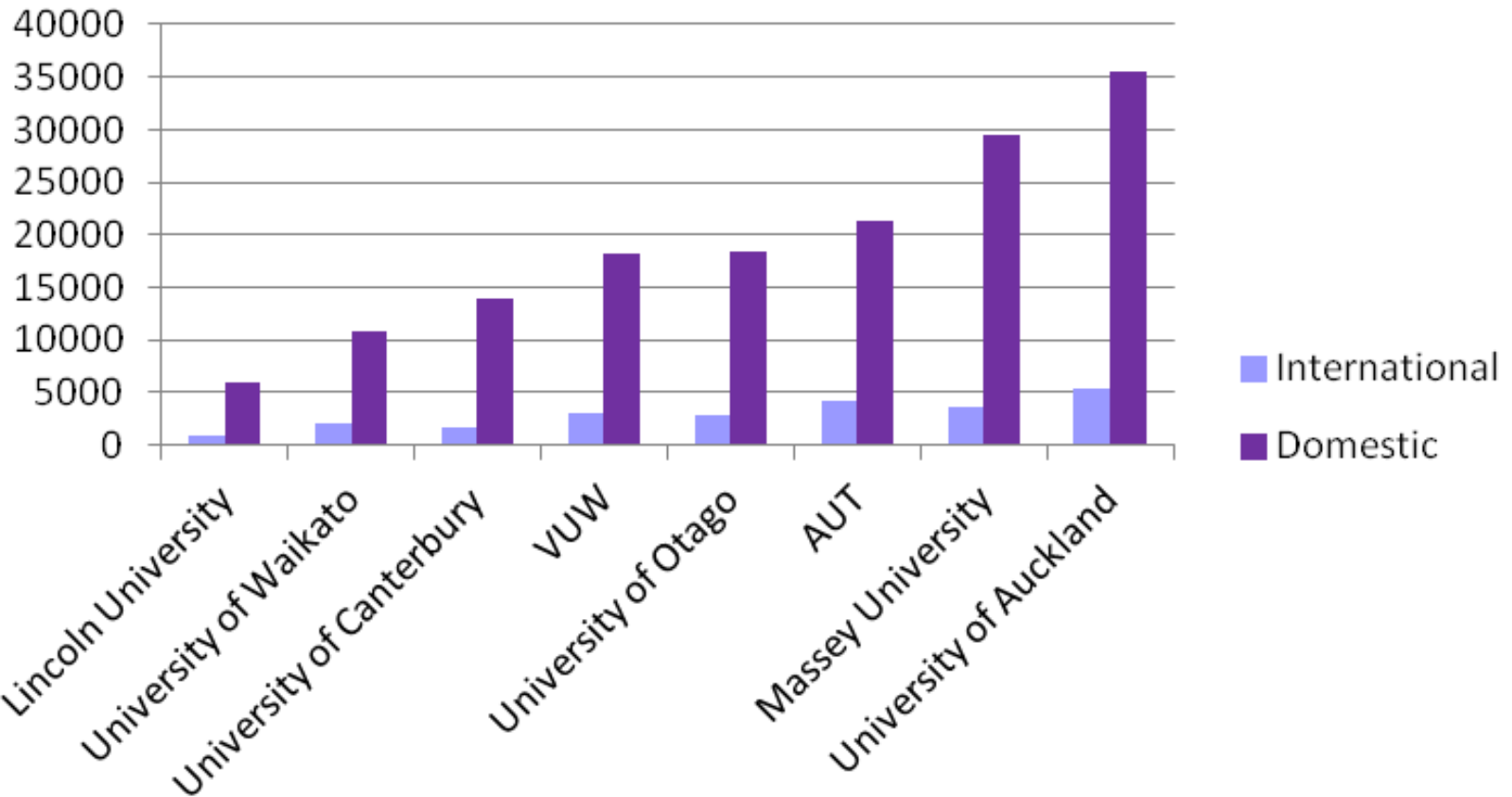

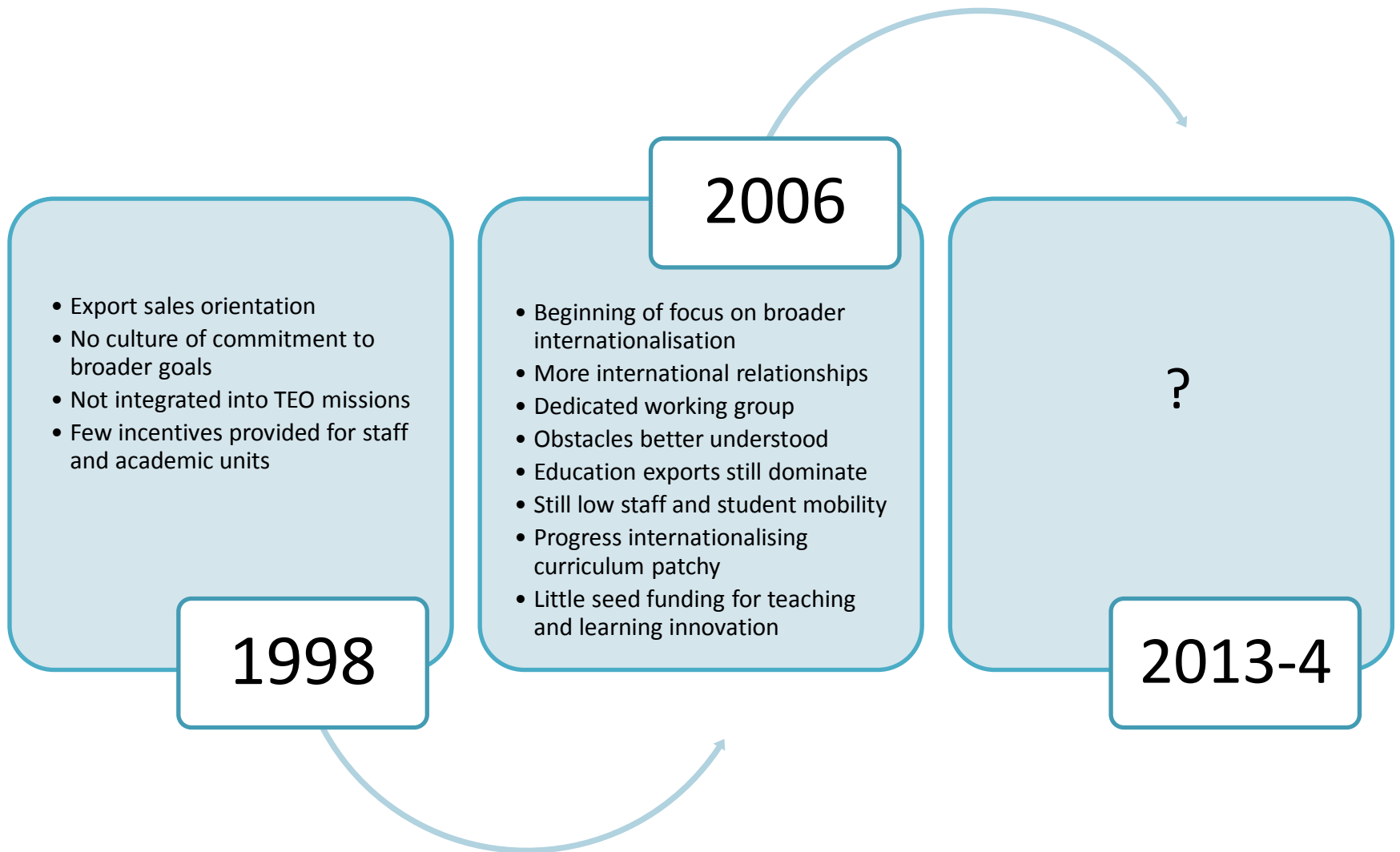
Total student enrolments in formal qualifications in 2012 in each New Zealand university



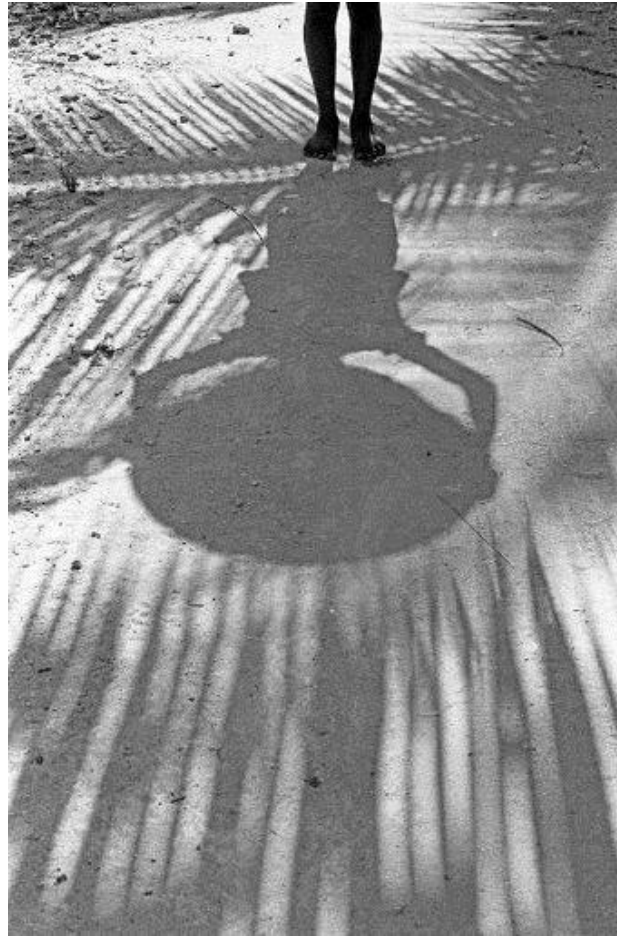
International and domestic student enrolments in New Zealand universities in 2012
