"Study Choices and Assistance"

FADE IN:

JUDY

Wow, that's exactly what my **course adviser** said. You learn at your own pace, but **you are not alone**. I was getting worried that I wouldn't finish before my visa ran out and she referred me to the **study advisers** in the learning support centre who showed me how to organise my time and what to do to pass.

JOHN

(he shakes his head in disbelief) WOW They DO your assignment for you?

JUDY

No they don't. They make sure you know what you have to do to pass. They explain how to use your ideas in your assignments. When I can't get an appointment with the **study advisor**, I sometimes go to the **group workshops**, and now I am getting better results!

JOHN

So, are you up to date now?

JUDY

Yes. And the adviser said just to keep trying. And if I get worried again about not finishing on time then I should talk to him about what to do.

JOHN

"Sounds like you've really worked out how to make the best use of the support offered"!
